### Herman Pagel & His Saddle

Herman Pagel was instrumental in making the Calumet County Historical Society who we are today. Our museum sits on land that was once Pagel land, and we even named our property "The Herman Pagel Historical Site." You can learn more about Herman on our website.

Herman was a horseman. For years, you could see him with his horses in local parades. In 1964 Herman went to Mexico and brought back this special saddle and rode it proudly in even more parades.

In the 1980's Herman sold the saddle to Dennis Stebane, who gave it to his wife Judith as an anniversary present. In 2023 Dennis and donated the saddle back to the Calumet County Historical Society.

#### WM Bechlem Tailor

Pictured here is a business that has pretty much disappeared from our modern society. However, at the turn of the century and up to mid-1950's, Tailoring was a prominent business in most well established communities.



Even after ready to wear clothing appeared in the fashion world, the local Tailor would still be called upon to make alterations, and keep the local citizens furnished with the latest fashions. Just look at old newspapers and you will see them full of fasting to the second strength of the second second

will see them full of fashion advertisements from local Tailor shops. A time when good quality, and

long lasting clothing was a necessity of life.

William Bechlem apprenticed as a tailor in Germany. Arriving in this country in 1879, opening his own business in 1886. Building a store located at 23 N. Madison St (the building in the upper pic ☐ ture), which is now the Chilton Upholstery shop. Then in 1909 moved his shop to 26 W. Main St. Chilton. (lower picture) Bechlem Clothing Store became the premier clothing store in the county, selling a wide variety of clothing and custom-made outfits. William operated the store

along with his sons, Otto and Edward. Bechlem Clothing finally closed its doors in 1968.

In the picture you will see Mr. William Bechlem dressed in his Odd Fellow Regalia. The Odd Fellows was a community Fraternal organization to promote social development and charitable contributions to the local community. 
